Lansing's population rose in the early 19th century and then declined. The population did not recover until after World War II and was later spurred by improvements to Routes 13 and 34 that sparked suburban development. The town's population has more than doubled in the past 40 years.




Residents of Note

Andrew Myers arrived from Maryland in 1792 to settle at the mouth of Salmon Creek at what is now called Myers Point. He built a small cabin and mill at the site and also built boats called bateaux which could carry six to eight tons of freight.



- William Goodwin came to Lansing in 1793 and settled at a site near the Asbury Church. He gave the land for Asbury Cemetery when his daughter died in 1794.
- Brigham Young in his boyhood, lived near Lansing Station. After his mother's death he and his father moved to Auburn. He was baptized in the Mormon Church in 1832 and became a famous leader of that church.
- Peter Wheeler was a black man whose life as a slave and his escape to freedom from a farm in what would become Lansing is detailed in an 1839 book. Chains and Freedom. Wheeler was born into slavery in New Jersey in 1789, and at the age of 11 separated from his family and sold to Gideon Morehouse. Around 1800 Wheeler was taken to Ludlowville by Morehouse. With the aid of his owner's relatives. Wheeler fled first to Albany. and then as a sailor out to sea.





Elisabeth Sheldon

created a beautiful garden in North Lansing where she grew and sold plants until her death in 2013. Town of Lansing



The Cayuga nation of the Haudosaunee [Iroquois], held the territory that would become the Town of Lansing until the American Revolutionary War. The Cayugas allied with the British and during a 1779 American military campaign their villages along the east side of Cayuga Lake were destroyed.

After the war, Lansing was part of the Town of Milton, today's Town of Genoa in Cayuga County. The first settlers to the area arrived about 1791. The town was formed in 1817 and became an original part of the newly created Tompkins County. Agriculture was a key component of Lansing's development and many dairy farms and a growing number of organic farms still operate today.





Lansing Points of Interest



Asbury Church

2978 N.Triphammer Road. Named for Francis Asbury, an early bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States. He preached at this church in 1811.

■ Myers Park

International Salt Co. donated the land in 1959 to Lansing for use as a town park on Cayuga Lake. It now offers picnic areas, seasonal swimming, a bird observation site, a walking area, rest-rooms, boat launch and camping. A "Music in the Park" series is offered in the summer.

■ The Federal House

175 Ludlowville Road. Built about 1813 for Abijah Miller, a prominent lawyer and the village's first postmaster. The elaborate entry features a leaded glass fanlight and sidelights. Today the house is a B&B.

■ Rogue's Harbor Inn

2079 E Shore Drive. Built between 1830 and 1842 by Daniel D. Minier, was also known as the Elm Grove Inn and Central Exchange Hotel. Grace Miller White (1868–1957) used the inn as the setting for her 1918 novel Judy of Rogues Harbor. It continues to operate as an inn and restaurant.



Salmon Creek

This scenic creek meanders 25 miles on its way from Cayuga County to Myers Park. It is a popular trout fishing stream and hiking area featuring a falls at Ludlowville.

■ The Townley House

Corner of Van Ostrand and Peruville Road. The only Second Empire house in Lansing was built in 1876. Today, it is a private residence.

New York State Public Service Commission rejected a plan to convert the coal-fired power plant in North Lansing to natural gas. The Cayuga Operating Company plant was sold to Riesling Power LLC, a NY City investment group.

1817 Town of Lansing was formed as an original part of the newly created Tompkins County. The town is named for John Lansing Jr., a New York delegate to the 1787 Constitutional Convention.

1884 South Lansing Brass Band formed. Later called the Lansing Cornet Band.

1891 Cayuga Lake Salt Company drills salt well in Myers Point.

1951 Cornell University and General Electric established what will become the Cornell Business & Technology Park at the Cornell Airport.
