Major Influences: Federal/State Grant Management

- Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Funding:
 - Anticipate FTA Formula Programs (\$2 million/yr) to be stable in 2019.
 - Expect to apply for competitive FTA capital grants for TCAT as they arise in 2019. In 2018, County was awarded \$2.29 million for electric buses for TCAT.
 - Anticipate NYSDOT to solicit applications for Federal Rural Public Transportation Program funding for 2019-2020. For 2017-18, County received \$2.7 million for TCAT & County projects.

Federal/State Grant Management

- New York State Funding:
 - Anticipate State Transit Capital Funding for TCAT to remain stable in 2019 (\$1.2 million).
 - Expect an increase in State Transit Operating Assistance formula for TCAT and Gadabout to be announced in current State Fiscal Year.

Mobility Management Strategies

County and Regional Partnerships

- Way2Go (Cornell Cooperative Extension of Tompkins County) informs the public, employers, human service agencies, and community organizations about transportation services and options. Provides public feedback to service providers.
- MoveTogetherNY regional mobility management for inter-county travel for employment & health care. Develop rural mobility options and the *Supports for Health* mobility vouchers.
- Finger Lakes Rideshare Coalition- coordinated by ITCTC: Cornell, Ithaca College, TC3, TST BOCES, Wells College, Binghamton University, & Tompkins County.

Mobility Management Strategies

Deploy Technology for Operations, Information & Customer Service

- TCAT Technology Project
- Gadabout IT Project
 - Completely re-organize operations, trip reservations and customer information to be more efficient and productive.
 - New platform for open trip reservations for community mobility services.
- Smartphone Apps, Videos
 - Publish Way2Go mobility service information
 - Enable carpools to work better
 - Improve operations of volunteer driver programs
 - Improve how Limited English Proficient individuals can access information & use services

Mobility Management Strategies

Employ Innovative Business Strategies/Models, i.e:

- Innovative Volunteer Driver Services
 - Way2Go is working with nine volunteer driver programs in the County to re-imagine how trip reservations, operations and customer service can be improved.
 - Report in 2019.
- Mobility-as-a-Service (MaaS) Business Model
 - FTA On-Ramp Program Recipient of technical assistance to create a MaaS business model by July 2019.
