## The Challenge

- Unchecked consumption / resource extraction
- Purposefully wasteful product design
- Lack of effective/sufficient infrastructure
- GLOBAL WASTE EPIDEMIC





## Is "Waste to Energy" a good option?

- Mercury, dioxins, lead acid gases, toxic fly ash picked up by grazing animals
- Does not eliminate need for landfills 1 ton of ash for every 4 tons incinerated
- Most expensive way to make electricity
- Requires "recyclables" for combustion

- A strong, self-sustaining business approach harvesting liabilities and transforming them into assets


## **ECONOMY**

## **Cost** to dispose of waste in Tompkins County: \$85 per ton

\$ earned through sales revenues at ReUse: \$2,000-\$3,000 per ton

## **ECONOMY**

## More than \$7.2 million in revenues since 2009 & nearly \$5 million in sales NOTE Widening gap between earned and contributed income, 2009-2018





Phase II — 2019


