2. TraCS

3. LiveScan

The integration with Spillman to TCSO is complete, however, integration with the Villages would require additional individual expenses per agency (approx \$5k per Village) as they are not presently LiveScan customers. As the State is investigation other vendor solutions, Biometrics 4 All, it was agreed that additional investment in L1/Comnetix was not an option.

4. Citrix / SJS

"End of Life" date for data ENTRY to SJS (DCJS Conversation) – Final day of entry was October 20, 2011.

Greg will follow up with Angie to see about sealing options. His proposed course of action is to set up one account to allow for changes in cases of sealing. He will coordinate test with Dryden. Additionally, we need to modify warrants as well as seals.

5. LETSS Administration

Personnel Module - City is moving training records into Spillman. Jake proposed removing all existing table details and replacing with a list he presented. TCSO may be interested in seeing options as IPD moves forward. Other items discussed: need to add unique items associated with individual agencies and a "misc" category. Question was asked whether view access can be granted to officers (answer is yes, however they can then see all of their agencies records).

Discussions of Homeland Security distributions. What will the decision process be in the future? There was perception that funds allocation has not been equal, however, Greg reminded all that a large portion of HS funds went toward Spillman project, which benefits all.
